Chart of Accounts

What is a Chart of Accounts?

A Chart of Accounts (COA) is an organizational tool that gives a breakdown of all the financial transactions, broken down into subcategories, that a company has conducted during a specific accounting period.

How do Chart of Accounts work?

Companies use a (COA) to help interested parties like owners, shareholders and investors obtain a clear view into a company's financial health. There are main categories of account types: revenue, expenditures, assets, liabilities and equity. These main categories function together to provide information to pull the company's financial statements together. To help users and those responsible for maintaining the classification of such accounts, charts of accounts typically contain a name, brief description as well as possible an account number.

How to set up a Chart of Accounts

Sample charts of accounts are readily available with a short search online and can be easily uploaded, or you could customize your own by using standard default numbers and customized sub-designations for different account types.

One important thing to keep in mind: it is helpful to give consideration to the information you want to be able to obtain from your financial statements – what information, accounts, expenses, income – do you want to manage? What information will be helpful as you make decisions about your business? Design and create your personalized chart of accounts based upon the answers to these questions!

Here is a very basic example:
